

**SR. ANN TROY, C.S.JB.**  
**October 24, 1916 – August 26, 2004**

Sr. Ann Troy was born on October 24, 1916 in Yonkers, New York to Leo Troy and Lucy Caruso. Sister entered the Congregation of Sisters of St. John the Baptist on September 8, 1933 and on September 9, 1935 made her first profession of vows.

From 1935 to 1940 Sister taught at Our Lady of Loretto, Our Lady of Pompeii and St. John Villa Academy in New York. On November 11, 1940 Sr. Ann very generously responded to God's call to serve His people in Chile for the next 18 years.

When Sr. Ann returned to the American Province on December 14, 1958, she resumed her teaching ministry from 1959 to 1974 at St. Dominic School, Bishop Burke High School, and Alphonsus College, where she also served as Dean of Students. Sister was appointed principal of the Sisters of St. John the Baptist Congregation's schools: St. Lucy School in Newark (1962-1965) and St. John Villa Academy Elementary School (1965-1967).

Following a very active life of missionary work, educational administration and teaching, Sr. Ann ventured into a whole new and different ministry...that of Coordinator of Religious Education. For the next 20 years (1974-1994) Sister found much joy and fulfillment in her work as Religious Education Coordinator at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish, Shrub Oak, New York, and at Our Lady of Fatima Parish, Scarsdale, New York. In September of 1995 Sr. Ann assisted with Mt. St. John Child Day Care Center in Purchase.

Chilean missionary, college administrator, principal, director of religious education and teacher...Sr. Ann Troy fulfilled the work God called her to do in a spirit of loving generosity and heartfelt dedication. As a person who loved life, she lived every moment to the fullest! No task was too difficult; no challenge too demanding.

In August of 2000 Sr. Ann Troy retired to Mt. St. John Convent, Purchase, New York. After 70 years of loving service to God, the Church and the Congregation, Sr. Ann Troy was called home to eternity on August 26, 2004 as she slept peacefully in her bed at Providence Rest Nursing Home.
