

Sr. Aurora Stufano
(October 28, 1909 - June 8, 1993)

Born Maria Stufano, in Italy, on October 28, 1909, Sr. Aurora entered the community on December 23, 1943 in White Plains, New York. She received the habit on August 29, 1944.

After professing first vows on August 30, 1945, Sr. Aurora was assigned to St. Lucy, Newark, New Jersey as Directress of Children. In July, 1946, she was transferred to Mt. Carmel Brooklyn, New York to do parish work. Once again she returned to care for the resident children at St. John Villa Academy, Staten Island from 1946 to 1950. Continuing the same work, Sister Aurora was then assigned to Mt. St. John Academy, Gladstone, New Jersey where she served for twenty-one years. Sr. Aurora's next assignment was to care for the elderly women at Providence Rest, Bronx, New York from September, 1971 until the day God called her on June 8, 1993.

After preparing supper for the Sisters in the Convent, Sister joined all the Sisters in the community room to watch a spiritual tape. Upon sitting down in the chair Sr. Aurora suffered a heart attack causing her death. However, attempts were made to revive her and then she was brought to the hospital, but all were unsuccessful.

Sister is remembered for her dedication in serving all God's children and for her faithfulness to her prayer life. Whomever Sister met, she greeted the person with smile. We will miss Sr. Aurora.
