

SISTER TARCISIA IANERI

(10/9/1898 - 6/5/78)

At Providence Rest, Bronx, New York, Sister Tarcisia Ianeri passed to her eternal reward on June 5, 1978.

Sister Tarcisia, christened Teresina, was born on October 9, 1898 in Compobasso, Italy. She entered Religious Life on February 9, 1920. About a year after her first profession in 1922, Sister Tarcisia left her native land for the United States and was assigned to St. Lucy's Convent, Newark. There she remained for over 50 years working quietly and faithfully in the humble task of soliciting. Many hours of each day of Sister Tarcisia's life were spent in deep prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. In 1975, Sister Tarcisia was sent to Providence Rest in the Bronx, to be given the special care she required after becoming very ill.

Sister Tarcisia is remembered by those with whom she lived and by the many lay people who came to know her through her apostolate. She was a generous giver, whether it was a piece of candy, a kind word or a smile. Never was she heard to complain or make demands. Her whole person was permeated by a gentleness of Spirit. We pray that like her, we may grow each day in the love of God.
